SLINGSHOT CHALLENGE STEP-BY-STEP

Sign up at SlingshotChallenge.org to register for the challenge, join our community and receive challenge updates. If you're under 18, you'll need to enter a parent/ guardian email address and get their consent to participate.

- Get inspired! Research an environmental issue in your community and check out what our National Geographic Explorers and past Slingshot Challenge Award Recipients are doing for a better tomorrow.
- **Imagine a better future.** Visit our Challenge Resources to download the toolkit and sign up for a workshop. Begin to research and design an impactful solution.
- Create a 1-minute video that brings attention to your chosen issue, explains your solution idea, and inspires others to join you.
- Share your video with the National Geographic Society and the world by submitting at Slingshot. Videosfor Change.org by **February 6, 2026** for a chance to receive up to \$10,000 in funding to further your journey. Award recipients will be announced May, 2026.

Requirements for Your Video

- Your video must be no longer than one minute
- Your video must be in English or Spanish
- You can film on any equipment, including your phone
- Files must be no larger than 200MB
- All content must be original or copyright-free

- You can work by yourself or in a team of up to six members
- Everyone on your team must be 13-18 years old at the time of submission
- Your solution must address a problem in your community related to one or more of the environmental topic areas listed below. For returning participants, It can be a new idea, or you can resubmit a previous idea you've developed further.
